## A Special Place at the Edge of the Ozarks

Diverse Landscape Protected by a Conservation Easement

It is hard to find a couple who do more for their community than Allan and Joicie Appell. Joicie has for years operated a community theater in the town of Clinton. Allan has been engaged in a number of civic ventures, including the extension of the Katy Trail west from Sedalia.

In October of this year, the Appells made a lasting gift to their community in the form of a conservation easement on their 356 acre farm in Henry County, Missouri. The Ozark Regional Land Trust gladly accepted this conservation easement to protect the farm's wildlife habitats and beautiful scenery.

The land lies on the far western extent of the Ozarks where they flatten out into the Osage plains. It is a microcosm of Missouri at large, containing mature hardwood forests on the rugged hills and valleys, tallgrass prairie where the land levels off, and oak savannas in between. There are also impressive sandstone bluffs and canyons along Tebo Creek, which flows into Truman Lake just south of the property.

The Appells have for many years been restoring native grasses and oak savannas. These



efforts have been widely recognized, including an award as "State Tree Farmers of the Year" in 2001.

The ORLT board and staff thank the Appells for their foresight in protecting this special place and for their donation to ORLT's Stewardship Fund to ensure that the land stays beautiful forever.

#### **NW Arkansas Land Donation**

Barbara Moorman has spent much of her life saving space for nature. Nearly a decade ago, Barbara and her mother donated a conservation easement on 67 acres just outside Fayetteville, Arkansas. ORLT serves as a back-up holder for that easement, which guarantees that a part of Kessler Mountain will remain wild as the city continues to grow around it.

In the early 1970s, Moorman purchased 40 rugged acres south of Fayetteville with the intention of building a home there someday. Years went by and she decided to live elsewhere. However, her desire to conserve wildlife habitat led her to make a donation of the land to ORLT in July 2009. Consistent with Barbara's wishes, ORLT intends to sell this land subject to a conservation easement. The proceeds will be deposited in the organization's Stewardship Fund to care for this and other land protected by ORLT.

### **Upper Meramec Restoration Work**

ORLT has worked with dozens of landowners on conservation easements and land donations. It has also helped landowners to access government conservation programs, such as CRP. In a couple instances, ORLT has offset the cost to landowners of implementing best management practices in key areas.

Another such project was recently facilitated by ORLT in the upper Meramec River watershed. ORLT worked with landowner Robert Dollard to restore approximately 1,200 feet of riparian corridor along Huzzah Creek, a major tributary of the Meramec. This project was a joint venture under the USDA's CP-22 program, with both the USDA and ORLT providing funding. In return, the landowner agreed to maintain the riparian buffer for at least 15 years. ORLT hopes to utilitize existing grant funds to help restore more riparian buffers in the upper Meramec watershed.
